## PAPER AND CARDBOARD

### FLATTENED OR CRUSHED:

- paper bags
- paper and cardboard packaging
- catalogues, fliers
- newspapers and magazines
- notebooks and books
- packaging paper
- school and office paper, printed paper



## METALS AND PLASTICS

### EMPTY, CRUSHED, FLATTENED, WITHOUT CUPS/TOPS:

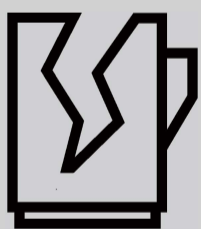
- plastic bottles and packaging
- plastic bags, sacks, aluminium foils
- jar lids and bottle tops
- empty food and drink tins/cans
- multiple-materials packaging, milk and juice containers
- plastic toys



## GLASS

### EMPTY, WITHOUT TOPS:

- glass cosmetics packaging (other than multiple material packaging)
- empty drink and food bottles, jars



## NON-RECYCLABLE

### OTHER NON-RECYCLABLE WASTE:

- used hygiene products, hygienic wipes, paper towels
- ceramics, porcelain, mirrors
- wallpapers
- disposable nappies, sanitary pads
- raw meat, animal and fish bones
- styrofoam households packaging
- oily and dirty paper
