SECOND WAVE OF CORONAVIRUS

The second wave of deadly Covid-19 has come and the Government is to introduce new rules to combat the increasing spread of COVID-19 in Poland. The health and safety of our employees and partners are of the utmost importance, which is why we keep a close eye on coronavirus developments. We will of course take measures as needed and follow the guidelines and instructions of the authorities.

NEW SOCIO-ECONOMIC RESTRICTIONS IN FORCE FROM DECEMBER 28

Prime Minister Mateusz Morawiecki announced the decision to impose new restrictions from **December, 28 onwards**.

There are some new restrictions ahead of us, including closure of ski slopes and a ban on free movement of people during New Year's Eve. Below you will find a list of imposed restrictions. Keep on reading!

New safety regulations – from December 28 to January 17

Decisions, taken by the Polish government, are meant to make Poles behave responsibly. The new safety rules will apply from December 28, 2020 to January 17, 2021, i.e. until the end of the winter school break. What will change?

- further restrictions in the functioning of shopping centres which will remain closed except for grocery stores, newsagents, drug stores, pharmacies, hairdressing and beauty salons, as well as independent, large-area furniture stores;
- limiting the functioning of hotels which would be available only to law enforcement services, medics, patients of specialized hospitals. Central sport centres (COS) and staff hotels will remain open;
- closed ski slopes;
- sport infrastructure will be opened only for professionals;
- 10-day quarantine for people coming to Poland on collective transport.

Current rules and regulations remain in force

- teenagers and children under the age of 16 cannot walk freely outdoors without a parent or a legal guardian from Monday to Friday from 8:00 to 16:00 (except day camps);
- public transport limitations:
 1. only 50% of seating positions could be occupied or
 2. 30% of the total number of seats and standing positions, while leaving at least 50% of the seats unoccupied in the vehicle.
- limitations in the places of religion worship – max. 1 person/15m²;
- gatherings limitation – max. 5 people;
- ban on weddings, holy communions and other parties;
- closed gyms, fitness clubs and aqua parks;
- limitation on number of customers in shops – max. 1 person/15m²;
- hours for seniors – from Monday to Friday from 10:00 to 12:00;
- closed restaurants. Meals only for take-away or home delivery;
- nurseries and kindergartens operate without further changes;
- hairdressing and beauty salons operate in a sanitary regime.

There is no change to any other restrictions previously in force. They become extended.

FAQ

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With over 4000 new coronavirus cases confirmed in one day, Prime Minister Mateusz Morawiecki declared that the whole of Poland would become a 'Yellow zone' on October, 10 (Saturday). This is done to hold back the second wave of deadly COVID-19 spreading across our country.

From Saturday, it will be mandatory to wear face masks in public in yellow zones as well. Anyone who does not wear a mask will have to present police or municipal guards a medical certificate or other document confirming the person's disability. However, there will be no need to cover faces in forests, parks, green areas, botanical gardens or beaches.

The new restrictions will cover:

- keeping distance of 4 sqm in closed areas with only 25% of the audience indoors;
- only 25% of the audience at outdoor sports venues;

- the number of people allowed to participate in weddings and other family celebrations will be limited to 75;
- church - it is compulsory to cover the mouth and nose, with the exception of worshipers. If the religious event is held outdoors, you must keep the social distance 1.5 m or cover your mouth and nose (except for worshipers);
- discos and nightclubs will be closed;
- restaurants are to be open until 10 pm;
- 75% occupancy of the facility in aqua parks and swimming pools;
- the number of participants is limited to 1 person per 10 sqm in amusement parks ;
- gyms with limit 1 person per 7 sqm;
- obligation to cover the mouth and nose in public transport;
- trade/commerce - it is compulsory for customers to wear disposable gloves or to use hand sanitizers when purchasing goods or services;
- only the staff and currently served clients may stay in beauty and hairdressing salons, tattoo studios.
